-Plus 2 Management:


21 students (8 grantees), Sunday to Thursday from 14h to 17h

20 students (2 grantees), Sunday to Thursday from 17h to 19h



Next courses

Explore After SLC: From 13th April to 17th June

This course will have 30 students coming from very different backgrounds (public/government schools, private schools, children homes, etc...)

EduLift is in conversation with the NGO *Change Fusion Nepal* working as partners for two new courses that could have a huge impact:

- -The first course would be designed for students who have failed SLC examinations and are essentially barred from the education system.
- -The second course would be designed for students who want to enter the Nepalese Labour Market but lack the guidance and/or resources.

Change Fusion Nepal will provide direct impact through the educational professionals they have in their network and will also bring forth their wealth of experiences in identifying, developing and growing social entrepreneurs.



EduLift Center as a Educational Hub

One of our main goals is to make use of EduLift facilities as a hub for educational initiatives and projects.



Currently we hold fun English classes for the very young monks who stay at a nearby monastery.

In a few weeks, we are planning to start morning Technology classes for the general public.

Current Challenges

In Kathmandu, currently we have around 12 non-electricity hours per day.

We have borrowed two generators to be able to start our program but it's not a long term solution.

In February we will start an online crowd sourcing initiative to get the funds to install a solar PV system which would make EduLift more sustainable and environment friendly.
